# Home Based Vendor

 Indiana Code 16-42-5-29 (2009)

 Named HEA 1309

 Section 29 Vendor

 Direct Person to Person






 May Only Sell at

 Road Side Stands

 Place along road where **you** sell **your** products.

 Farmers Markets

# HBV Label

-  Your name and address
-  Ingredients
-  Net weight, grams and ounces
-  Date food was processed
-  10 point type:

“This product is home produced and processed and the production area has not been inspected by the State Department of Health.”

 Complete

 “Registration Application for Wholesale Distributor”
